

NEW UNIFORM



Dress Code

Blazer	Green with School badge; may be removed during break/lunch.	
Shirt	White, long or short-sleeved; must remain tucked in; undergarments/T-shirts	
	must not be visible through shirt.	
Skirt	Below knee, dark green/black, tartan and pleated School skirt (box pleats).	
Trousers	Formal, black, tailored, no turn-ups; jeans, informal or skin-tight trousers not permitted.	
Tights	Plain, skin-coloured, or black.	
Socks	Plain black, unbranded, ankle-length.	
Tie	Green/Red/Gold, striped School tie, properly tied with length just above waistband. Top button must be fastened and not visible.	
Jumper	Plain grey, V-neck, knitted with long sleeves. Can be worn in addition to blazer but not on its own. Sweatshirts not permitted.	
Shoes	Formal plain black leather or simulated leather, with low heel. Not permitted: Branded (eg. Nike, Adidas etc.), coloured or canvas shoes/trainers/boots.	
Outdoor	Coats, scarfs.	
Clothing	Students are not permitted to wear outdoor clothing during lessons.	
Badges	Only authorised badges are permitted e.g. House badges, achievement badges. Any item (eg. Kirpan) worn for religious reasons will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.	
Hair	No extremes of style (e.g. shaved lines, unnatural colouring). Hair ornaments should be discrete in size, design and colour, including hairbands. Headdress worn for religious reasons should be non-patterned.	
Jewellery	Permitted:	Not Permitted:
	1 pair of ear studs 1 nose stud 1 ring 1 gold or silver necklace 1 bracelet	Any other piercings, including Hooped earrings Ear tunnels, tapers or tragus Lip piercings Dangly earings
Makeup	KS3 (Years 7 – 9)	
	Use of subtle foundation, concealer and/or mascara permitted.	
	KS4 (Years 10 – 11) As per Year KS3, but subtle eyeliner is permitted, as is nail polish. Any nail polish must be a single colour. Acrylic nails and/or false eyelashes are not permitted.
