YEAR 12 BIOLOGY TRIP TO CRANEDALE - Report by Erika Pond (Year 12)



Last weekend, a group of Year 12 students and 4 teachers visited the Cranedale Centre, located in North Yorkshire, for three days of field work relating to our Biology studies.

Soon after arriving and settling into our rooms, we were taken out to set some humane traps in order to observe the organisms living in the nearby woodland. We were taught how to set them and learnt about the ethics behind many different types of traps. On the second day, we were driven to two different sites, Brompton Beck and Settrington Beck, where we investigated the effect of crayfish on the biodiversity of a river. Despite the chilly weather and the rain, we all managed to gather some interesting data, even if the data sheets got a little soggy in the process! Lastly, we



planned our own investigations and carried them out at an area of coastline called Filey Brigg. Here, we spotted seal pups and formed lines of transects down the rocky shore, invoking quite a few questions from the public.

Amongst all the wonderful activities we took part in, I think my favourite moment is a tie between investigating barnacles and watching Mr Stainton fall into the river! Our visit to the Cranedale Centre was an incredibly useful and unforgettable experience for everyone who went, no matter how much we complained about the cold!

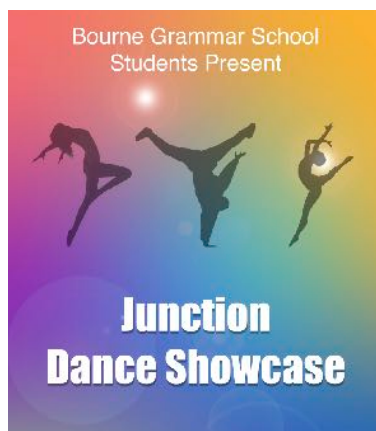
