Message from Headteacher

Wednesday's *Musical Expressions: An Evening of Choral and Orchestral Masterworks* concert at Bourne Abbey Church was a night of outstanding quality and musical ambition. The setting provided a fitting backdrop for a programme that demanded real precision, nuance and maturity, and the students rose superbly to the occasion.

The programme demonstrated impressive breadth and depth, spanning a wide range of musical styles and traditions. Particularly striking was the emotional intensity and sustained discipline required in Arnesen's *Stabat Mater*, a substantial and demanding work that calls for concentration, insight and musical understanding over an extended period. The assurance and poise shown in performing repertoire of this scale represent the highest standard I have seen at Bourne Grammar School, and a level of performance rarely encountered within schools.

What stood out throughout the evening was the level of ensemble awareness demonstrated by all performers. Music of this nature requires not only technical accomplishment, but also the ability to listen carefully to one another, showing patience, resilience and a shared commitment to achieving something greater collectively than could be achieved individually.

Our sincere thanks go to Mr Tomlinson and Mr Jones for their expertise, leadership and dedication in preparing students so thoroughly for this performance, as well as to Father Stephen for hosting us in such an inspiring venue, and all those others who helped create such a memorable evening. We are also grateful to Delaine Bus Services for their generous sponsorship of the event, and to parents and families for their continued encouragement.



In that same spirit of supporting the arts, I am absolutely delighted and deeply grateful for the generosity of the Len Pick Trust, whose transformational and highly substantial donation will enable a complete reimagining of our Main Hall facilities. This represents a major investment in the future of the School. Musical Expressions: An Evening of Choral & Orchestral Masterworks

The concert opened with Mozart's overture to the opera *Mitridate, re di Ponto*. From the very first notes, the bold sound of the string orchestra immediately engaged the audience, setting the tone for an evening of high musical quality. The contrasts of light and shade within this lesser-known work were executed with confidence, precision, and energy under the assured direction of Mr Weston.

Accompanied by Ms Bidwell, the Senior Chamber Choir's performance of Eric Whitacre's *Seal Lullaby* provided a moment of gentle contrast. The choir's warm, blended tone wove seamlessly around the flowing piano accompaniment, creating a serene and atmospheric soundscape.

The opportunity to perform as a soloist with orchestra is always a notable occasion. The first soloist of the evening, Lily Martin, performed the second movement of Krommer's Clarinet Concerto in E-flat Major with poise and assurance. She shaped the sweeping melodic lines with sensitivity, producing a lyrical and expressive performance.

The combined Junior and Senior Chamber Choirs then presented Franz Biebl's Ave Maria with remarkable purity of tone, filling the Abbey with a sense of stillness and reverence. Written for four-part upper voices with an additional trio of soloists, the unaccompanied seven-part textures present a considerable challenge; however, the performance was delivered with apparent ease. The trio—Sophie Robinson, Alix Smith, and Anya Copestake—each contributed individual solo passages between the choral sections. Their voices, heard in the silence of the Abbey, created a profoundly moving and reflective atmosphere.

Following this, the string orchestra presented their second piece of the evening, Entracte No. 3 from Schubert's *Rosamunde*. Once again, the students demonstrated their ability to convey gentle, flowing melodies with warmth and sensitivity, bringing out Schubert's expressive lyricism to full effect.



The first half concluded with Holly Potts performing the first movement of Mozart's Oboe Concerto. Her performance demonstrated both technical accomplishment and expressive warmth, highlighting the full expressive range of the instrument.

Following the interval, choir and orchestra combined, joined by Mr Jones on the organ, for a substantial performance of Kim André Arnesen's setting of the *Stabat Mater*. Spanning approximately 35 minutes, the work moves between intimate, hushed passages and powerful, expansive climaxes. The performers led the audience on a compelling emotional journey, beginning in grief and gradually unfolding towards hope and consolation. This was an outstanding collective achievement and a fitting culmination of the concert, showcasing the depth of talent and musical development within the school.

Five Y13 Biology students recently completed the Y13 British Biology Olympiad. The Y13 British Biology Olympiad challenges and stimulates students with an interest in Biology to expand and extend their talents. The competition consisted of two, 45-minute multiple choice papers which were sat online. The students performed exceptionally well and achieved the following results: Mayra Narang achieved a Gold. This meant that Mayra qualified and completed the next round of the competition which is an outstanding achievement. Jonathan Blair and Will Lau achieved a Silver. Kieran Farrell achieved a Bronze. Freya Fairhead-Abrahams achieved a Highly Commended.

Below is a write-up by **Jonathan Blair and Kieran Farrell** reflecting on their experience:

Olympiad preparation sessions that were put on every week were very entertaining and informative. A group of around four students gathered on Fridays to attempt past questions, with the help of Dr Hanson, which covered a variety of unseen content along with topics that we have already covered.

We used our knowledge of the subject to answer the questions to the best of our ability. Overall, the discussions were fun and gave us an opportunity to learn more about the subject that wouldn't usually be covered inside of lesson time and made for a unique and very valuable experience.

Both papers were multiple choice, but we all agreed that we found the second paper much more challenging. A wide variety of topics were tested, including animal behaviours and genetics. Some content we had covered in A-Level, and others we definitely hadn't! It was a great opportunity to apply our knowledge to new problems and unfamiliar content which we all thoroughly enjoyed. We are grateful to Dr Hanson for giving up her time to help us prepare and sit the papers.
