This week has been Careers Week and I want to thank Mrs Elliot for all the time and effort put into a variety of events and activities that have occurred. We have had lunchtime talks with specific focuses on Design, Accountancy, Languages, Law, Engineering and The Forces in addition to a mini fair that included the NHS, ICT, Health and Beauty, Construction, Food, The Forces and finally the Fire Service. Teachers have included short curriculum-linked videos into their lessons this week and each Thought for the Week presentation opportunity in tutor time has also been linked specifically to futures and careers. This comprehensive approach to the Careers Programme across all year groups has helped raise the profile of Futures conversations and we hope, encouraged our students to engage more actively in thinking through their next steps.

It is appropriate at this time to identify the sorts of future plans our current Year 13 have as they look ahead to life beyond school. Reading through the database of offers and destinations I am struck by the breadth of interest that is clear to see and it is wonderful to see that talents of all kinds are able to find ambitious routes forward. We have a number of students heading into the Creative Arts with offers for Filmmaking. Theatre and Live Performance, Fine Art, Art History and Visual Culture and Music including a place at the Liverpool Institute for the Performing Arts. We have a number of students heading into the very worthwhile world of sustainability, with future options in Environment Management, Environmental Geoscience, Ecology and Conservation, Marine Biology and Oceanography and Landscape Architecture. It is interesting also, to see the number of students with offers for Criminology and Psychology as well as more niche options such as Equine Behaviour, Human Neuroscience, Television and Film Set Design and Fashion Marketing. We have students looking at joining The Forces, several looking at Nursing of varying types, interest in Paramedic Science or Physiotherapy, a core of Computer Scientists, several Aerospace Engineers and - a profession close to my own heart for obvious reasons! - some looking at Teaching. And none of this should detract from the large numbers of students still looking at the more traditional academic pathways such as Medicine, Engineering, The Sciences, Mathematics, English, Business and Economics, Law, History, Geography and many others. There are so many options out there and so many opportunities for young people to channel their interests towards a future career and I hope all our students are able to plot their own individual pathways in the months and years ahead.

#### YEAR 9 GCSE OPTION CHOICES - Mr Ransom, Deputy Head

Before students can select and submit option preferences, access to the options system must be activated. The unique access code that is required to activate the options system was sent to the <u>School email account</u> of each Year 9 student on Wednesday 22 February. Please note that this is a one-time-use-only code; once used it will not be needed again and cannot be used again.

Once activated, the options system can be accessed by going directly to <a href="www.sims-options.co.uk">www.sims-options.co.uk</a> and logging in with the email account and password set up at the time of activation.

Once option preferences have been successfully submitted no further action is required. Your preferences, and any subsequent changes you make, will only be submitted when you 'Save' your option selections Please note: Due to a system enhancement, you can now use the student's School email account to sign in to log your options. The parental consent box does not need to be ticked.

### WORLD BOOK DAY 02/03/2023 - Report by Mrs Clark


