After a long drive in the minibus up to Yorkshire, we were all relieved to reach the Youth Hostel in Ingleton and enjoyed our last dinner before the expedition started - fish and chips. For a couple of hours afterwards we wandered around the village and a quick game of football with the locals was played before we headed back to our rooms to prepare for an early start the next day.

On Friday morning, for our group (The Sole Sisters) breakfast in the hostel was followed by a 45-minute drive to Pen-y-Ghent - the first of the three Peaks of Yorkshire we were to climb during our trip. After a long morning of steep incline, we made our way up Plover Hill and eventually to the summit: celebrating with lunch and a long break. Then, after a short and sunny walk down into Horton, we arrived at our first campsite and set about preparing for the night. Whilst some of us dealt with the temperamental showers, the rest began cooking dinner on our Trangias - a surprisingly edible mix of Balti sauce, silken tofu and green beans, we then all settled in for the night.

We were up before the sun had risen above Pen-y-Ghent the next morning and had to defrost ourselves with porridge and coffee before packing away - with our tents and the pair of socks left on one of them completely covered in ice. Thankfully, the walk to Ingleborough warmed us up and as we started our second peak, our group was enjoying the good weather. After summiting much quicker than we expected, we put up our 2-man-tent at the top and spent a couple hours up there reuniting with the other BGS Gold DofE groups and cooking up our boil in the bag meals - all of which were violently orange. That night at Moorgarth Farm was thankfully much warmer and we all had an early night to prepare us for the long day ahead.



Our third day was undoubtably the longest, and saw us walking around 24km to reach Dent so we could hike up Whernside on the last day. We weren't deterred by the long distance however, and trekked through the moorland towards the Ribblesdale Viaduct for lunch, and then onwards to Dent. At the campsite, our supervisors surprised us all with Easter eggs, and this combined with working showers, had us all in good spirits despite how tired we were.

For the whole of Monday, heavy rain and strong wind settled over our area of Yorkshire and so we set off as early as we could and steeled ourselves to get up and over Whernside as quickly as possible. We reached the end of our route within three hours of starting and both impressed with ourselves and completely soaked, set up our emergency shelter whilst we waited for the minibus.
