This week has seen all Houses gathering for House Assemblies and plotting their plans for the next stages of Inter-House competition. Vertical identity through a House system is an extremely effective way of bringing young people together and providing another layer of pastoral support in a big School. The House Table Tennis competition has just finished, next week sees the House Chess Tournament and the final week of term will see the judging of the "eggs-iting" historical egg challenge where interested students turn an egg into a figure from history. All good fun with an edge of real competition that gives our students an additional reason to enjoy coming to School! I would also like to commend our Houses on their outward facing charitable work. The recent support for both the local Food Bank and those in need via the Shoe Box Appeal has been enhanced earlier this week by a collection for Ukrainian refugees. Over £1,500 was raised to support those displaced by the war and the money has been donated to the global effort to mitigate the impacts of the crisis via Save The Children. Congratulations to all involved and a particular thank you to our House Leaders for their ongoing work in leading and supporting our Houses.

It has also been a particularly successful week in sport. I watched some great netball matches against Spalding Grammar on Monday and I'm delighted to report that our U12, U14 and U15 teams all sit top of their respective netball leagues. The U12s, U14s and U16s were also South Lincolnshire Tournament winners. Our girls' football teams are also impressing with the U16s in the County Cup Final (having already won the Regional Futsal Competition and the Superzone Competition), the U15s winning their Superzone Competition and the U13s shortly to play their County Cup Semi-Final. The boys are also experiencing significant success, with the U12, U14 and U16 teams top of their leagues while the U15s have already secured their league title. The U15s and U16s are in their County Cup Finals and the U12s and U14s in their respective Semi-Finals. Well done to all players and coaches.

Finally, I was delighted to hear today that two of our Year 13 students, Georgina Harrison and Henry Hussy, have qualified for the BDFPA (British Drug Free Powerlifting Association) National Finals. Mr Sutherland is our Strength and Conditioning guru with a significant interest in lifting himself, and he has been running a club for all those interested in developing their strength and technique in this tough individual sport. To have two students reach national recognition is a significant achievement and it is worth adding that both look set to challenge for national records in their respective age and weight classes. Henry managed to lift a combined total of 450kg in a recent competition (162.5kg Squat, 105kg Bench Press and 182.5kg deadlift) and Georgina, in the under 60kg weight class, was able to lift a combined total of 307.5kg (97.5kg Squat, 72.5kg Bench Press and 137.5kg Deadlift), more than five times her body weight! We wish both of them well in the National Finals and hope they are able to perform at their best.


THIS YEAR IN SCIENCE - Report by the Students of 7E

A note from Miss Mizen, Teacher of Biology - 7E have had a fantastic term in Science and wanted to share details of what they have been doing with you this year. I hope that this will give you an insight into our KS3 science lessons and some of the work the students have been doing.

This year so far in Science, 7E have been looking at cells, forces, acids and alkalis, reproduction, electrical circuits and simple chemical reactions.

In Biology we have covered cells and reproduction. In our cells topic we created models of specific cells that we researched. Many involved cake, which we were all able to sample in the presentation lesson. Pictured are all of us with our models. In the reproduction topic we learned about reproduction in humans and plants, including the male and female reproductive system, gestation, and flowers and pollination.

In Physics we have studied forces and circuits. We have learned how to rearrange equations,



In Chemistry we have looked at acids and alkalis and simple chemical reactions. In acids and alkalis, we studied the pH scale (using indicators) and carried out many practicals using different chemicals. In our most recent topic, simple chemical reactions, we have been focussing on different types of reactions. Practicals have included reacting metals with acids, testing for different gases, burning magnesium and the chip pan fire experiment, where water was added to burning oil to show how dangerous it is to extinguish an oil fire with water. It also included the 'whoosh bottle' demonstration where we saw that light, heat and sound being given off are evidence for a chemical reaction taking place, and discovered that the products of complete combustion are carbon dioxide and water.
