
Week ending Friday 20 May 2022 From Alastair Anderson, Headteacher

On Monday 23 May, all students in Year 7 and 8 will be presented with their ROOSTER booklet; it is important that they keep this booklet in their bags and bring it to each of their lessons next week. Teachers in all subjects will dedicate class time for students to pause and reflect on their studies and to complete the booklet as honestly as they can.

ROOSTER week falls between the close of students' end-of-year assessments and prior to parental reports being released; it is therefore, the perfect time for students to reflect on their own strengths and weaknesses and – with guidance from their teachers and use of their Progress Ladders - to understand how to address any weaknesses and what they need to do to improve further.

COVID sadly impacted the amount of metacognition work that was possible with the current Year 8 cohort, Year 7 students have however, spent valuable curriculum time this year understanding how to learn effectively and how to become successful independent learners. Allowing students, the time and space to

reflect on their academic achievements is part of this process and the BBL (Building Better Learners) Programme.

I hope the week helps our amazing students to better understand how well they are doing across the academic curriculum and that it offers parents some insight, from the child's perspective, about academic progress before they receive the end-of-year school report.

LINCOLNSHIRE CLUBS ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS – SATURDAY 14 MAY 2022

Congratulations to Lawson Capes (Year 8) who won the county shot putt title with a throw of 14.27m for under 15s. This year he has stepped up to a 4kg (from 3kg) shot, as well as, having to compete in the Under 15 age group (equivalent to Years 8 & 9). Despite being very early in the season, this qualifies him for the English Schools Championships in July and puts him at number 1 in the UK! An outstanding achievement. Well done.

Lawson has since added to this performance in the rain at Loughborough throwing 14.48m, continuing his progress this year.

TENNIS – Report by Ms Bowtell, PE Teacher

Two exciting tournaments took place this week within School, one for boys and one for girls in Years 7-9. 'Play your way to Wimbledon' is a national tournament which enables talented Tennis players to compete locally, in clubs or schools and to then qualify to compete against other winners in their county at a central venue. If successful at this level individuals move on to a national stage held at All England Club, Wimbledon.

The first event was the girl's event where we had ten girls fiercely competing for the Bourne Grammar title, some had played many tournaments and for others it was their first experience of competitive Tennis and they were starting to put into action their understanding of scoring from class lessons. The weather as usual was varied ranging from searing heat to pouring rain but nothing could dim their enthusiasm.

The Final was played between three players in a round robin format where each player plays one match against all the others and the player who wins the most games wins overall. This was between Libby Bird, Poppy Mclearnon and Shiksha Kaur and what a close event it was.

The competition between Shiksha and Poppy really was a battle of the power shots with equal numbers being struck across the court, whereas in all of Libby's games, she attempted to out play and out think her opponent in her placements of her strokes. The play off for 4th and 5th was also competitive with Alice Barrett finally wearing down Stella Mcdermott's relentless ability to return shots from all angles on the court. 6th and 7th place was a playoff between Hamsini Raja and Melissa Peng and 8th, 9th and 10th was again a round robin between Jessy Sayers, our most enthusiastic player), Grace Cullen and Kiki Timmins, both Year 7 students. The final Winner was Poppy Mclearnon.

The boy's competition was played the next day in glorious weather and with 9 entrants. This event also had Year 9 boys competing against Year 7 students for whom this was their first taste of a real Tennis competitive match. One of the Year 7 students excelled and surprised many of the older boys with his play, Saul Annis and led to near upsets in the matches with the top seeds.

Donald McGeorge was not a surprise to the Year 9 students having played weekly against them to develop his resistance to the pace of their shots and demonstrated how much he has learnt already by reaching the final against Atte Maaranen.
