CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR RE-ELECTED

I am delighted to report that our Chair of Governors Ian Mears and his Vice-Chair Robert Parker have been re-elected to serve for a further year. Our congratulations to both. There is of course no expectation that our most senior governors should be alumni but by coincidence it is the case that both Mr Mears and Mr Parker are former students of our School.

GOVERNORS MEET AGAIN - VIRTUALLY

Some may feel that there are more pleasant ways to spend a Wednesday evening than in a governors' meeting but attending the first meeting of the year really was a pleasure. All students and staff are back in School now but the governors do not spend their time in our daytime 'bubble' system so our Chairman made the wise decision that the governors should meet virtually for the time being.

Wednesday's meeting was attended, virtually, by several members of the Leadership Team who presented reports to the Governors. The good news came thick and fast. Mr Ransom gave his usual detailed presentation on this year's outstandingly impressive GCSE and A-Level results. He then briefed on the summer's extensive refurbishments - a complex project he led, along with the Finance Department. Mr Brunker briefed on the operation of the School under the bubble system and it was good to hear him put into words what we all see in School every day: our students are able to get on with their education far more satisfactorily under the present constraints than anyone had dared to imagine. It was noted, though, that additional burdens now fall on the teaching staff but also that all colleagues are rising impressively to the challenges they now face as they go about their daily routines in School. We have been well supported by our cleaning contractor, too, and the cleaners who are on-site during the School day are doing an efficient and thorough job as they do their bit to keep us all safe.

Following the Prime Minister's Tuesday evening briefing, it seems likely that of the predictions regarding life in School ventured in these pages in recent weeks, the most pessimistic will come to pass ... it is probable now that the School will operate in bubbles for months.

Mr Hewitt briefed on the plans we have worked up in discussion with the Subject Leaders for ensuring that students' education will continue in each of as many scenarios as we might possibly expect to face, up to and including total closure. We are well prepared but, of course, we hope very much that the School will continue to be fully open to all, as it has been since the start of term.

The meeting also discussed our early-stage plans for exciting further major development of our School's estate.

SCHOOL YARD

With some fifteen buses manoeuvring and parking in the yard and countless cars delivering students every morning, the surface of the School yard takes a bashing and it is evidently now in need of replacement rather than further repair. Of course, replacement of the surface can be contemplated only during a period of total closure and throughout the recent closure and summer holiday regular access was necessary for contractors' vehicles working on the refurbishment and the Astroturf pitch. So the resurfacing work has been planned for the October half-term week. That is likely to be the only suitable window for some months so, assuming the weather is not an impediment, the work will be done and the surface should then need little maintenance for many years to come.

NEW HEADTEACHER - UPDATE

I am in regular contact with Alastair Anderson. It is very important to me that I do all I possibly can to ensure that my successor receives the smoothest and most comprehensive handover that I can muster and to that end Mr Anderson will visit the School for two days in November. If his commitments at his present school allow, he will visit in December too. With the Covid restrictions in place it will unfortunately not be possible to run some of the events that were planned in order to give our new Headteacher the very warmest of welcomes. It will not be possible for him to meet as many of his new colleagues and the governors as had been planned. Nevertheless a comprehensive programme has been worked up and I look forward to welcoming Mr Anderson back to the School. I know that everyone will do all they can to make him welcome in January when, as is likely, he takes over at a time when the School is operating in far from its usual manner due to the continuing Covid rules.
