RECOGNISING STUDENTS' SUCCESSES

Since rising student numbers forced our annual presentation of academic awards to be spread over two separate occasions, we have held our traditional Speech Night in Bourne Abbey in late November and a more informal Prize Night at School in the preceding summer term. Between the two events all year-groups are covered.

Due to the School's closure period the Summer 2020 Prize Night, at which prizes for students in Years 7-10 would have been awarded, was abandoned. It has already been confirmed that the November 2020 Speech Night, at which prizes for students in last year's Years 11-13 would have been presented, cannot happen. It is of course hoped that the normal cycle can resume with the Summer 2021 Prize Night but, for now, we have hundreds of hard-working students who have achieved remarkable success in difficult circumstances and in the course of a very difficult year to whom prizes are rightly owing.

I am delighted to report that the Chair of Governors has approved the proposal to run a single online event in November which, along with a special commemorative printed programme will allow us to celebrate and place upon permanent record the successes of the prize-winners from the fractured 2019/20 School Year. Details of the date, which is likely to be the evening of Thursday 26 November, and the Internet link for the online element of the event will be distributed to prize-winners and their parents/carers in due course.

Our special event will lack the special ceremony attainable only in the Abbey but the prizes will carry the same prestige and will be given in the same spirit of celebration and commendation. It will be the first occasion for many years on which prizes for students across the entire School will be presented at a single event...we find, once again, that amidst the difficulties of the Covid-19 constraints lie some welcome conveniences.

PARENTAL CONTACT WITH STAFF

It is almost certainly the case that this year's opportunities for parents to consult with the teaching staff will have to consist entirely of online meetings. With that in mind, and in view of the unique circumstances which have affected all schools since March, we are presently considering how best to offer opportunity for parental consultation with staff this year. As in all things a range of constraints mean that no model will satisfy everyone and it is highly likely that whatever we decide will involve a significant element of compromise and prioritising. Our plans are not yet complete but I expect to be able to communicate the model to parents/carers within the next few weeks.

ROAD SAFFTY

I have received a letter of concern from a resident of Great Northern Gardens. The resident is concerned about parents parking there at the end of the School day and the safety issues this may raise. I have also from time to time received similar messages from the management of *Jewson's* yard. I always respond to the effect that congestion is inevitable around any large school which has a wide catchment area but that any inconvenience is likely to last for no more than twenty minutes or so. That said, and cognisant of the scale of the end-of-the-day egress of students here and the limited number of places for private cars to wait, I must appeal to parents/carers to have regard to our neighbours, including those which are commercial premises, as they collect students at the end of the School day.
