VIRTUAL PRIZES & AWARDS EVENING - Thursday 26 November at 7pm

It is very much my wish that in spite of the unique circumstances we must make every effort to recognise, formally and properly, the manifold achievements of our students from the fractured 2019/20 School year.

For too much time the students were not in School but throughout they continued to learn, support each other and contribute to School's virtual atmosphere in the manner which is so distinctively theirs. Our students' endeavours and exertions were noticed. As in any other year, the achievements of the 2019/20 School year will be recorded for posterity and the students given the warmest and most sincere acclamation that we can muster for them.

Our Virtual Prizes & Awards Evening, which combines the usual November Speech Night (for students in the current Years 11-13 plus last year's Year 13) and last summer's Speech Night (for students then in Years 7-10) will take place online on Thursday 26 November 2020 at 7.00pm. I am looking forward very much to this happy occasion. All prize-winners and recipients of awards, and their parents/carers, will receive a personal invitation which will include the link to the live broadcast. Happily, though, for the first time this year, the fact that the event is to be broadcast means that everyone in the School community can share in the evening and not just the relatively limited number that can be crammed into Bourne Abbey or our Main Hall.

I very much hope that you will wish to join us to share in this special occasion, to celebrate the achievements of our students and to recognise above all that in the face of so much obstruction, our School is very much alive and is as busy as ever. INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENTS

Ed Lowe (Year 13) has been a keen road cyclist since the age of 7, but it was only in 2016 that he started to compete seriously in National Endurance races, with some success. In June 2018, he decided to try Velodrome Cycling and quickly realised that he had the skills to become a Track Sprinter. In March 2019, he was invited to join the Great Britain Cycling Team (GBCT), as one of only four Youth Apprentices (U16) for Track Sprinting. He was assigned his own coach and attended weekend training sessions at different velodromes.

Ed competed in his first Junior National Track Championships in August 2019 and managed to break a National Record for the 500 metre time trial and do very well in several other sprint races. He went on to break two further National Records for Team Sprinting and the Flying 500 Metres. As a result of these performances, he was invited onto the Junior Squad of the Great Britain Cycling Team (GBCT) as a Track Sprinter in December 2019. In January 2020, Ed represented Great Britain for the first time in Apeldoorn, Holland.

Ed has been specialising as a Man 1 for the Team Sprint, as he has an outstandingly fast start. In January, Ed lead Team-Blackline to a Bronze medal in the Team Sprint at the Men's Elite National Track Championships as Man 1, behind the GBCT Podium and GBCT Senior Teams, making them the fastest amateur team in the UK. At the time, Ed was only 16.

During lockdown there have been no competitions, but Ed continued to train hard. In September 2020 Ed was selected for a second year in the Junior Squad (U18) of the Great British Cycling Team (GBCT).

Last week in Manchester, Ed took part in a GBCT race assessment training camp, alongside the Senior and Podium squads. All riders had to do a Standing Lap (250 metres Time Trial), and Ed posted a time of 17.64", the fourth fastest in the GBCT, and faster than Jason Kenny MBE, the six-time Olympic Champion. Ed was informed that his time was astonishingly fast and beat the Junior World Record. In the Flying 200 Metre event, Ed posted a time of 10.51", which was a Personal Best by over 0.3" and another world class time for a Junior. He also had a match-sprint race against Jason Kenny, which Jason won but only by about three metres. Ed has now already exceeded his targets for the Junior GBCT, and as such is in a good place to be selected into the Senior Academy of the GBCT in September 2021 and become a professional athlete.
