The news this week has been good. Not only is the Covid infection rate coming down and the vaccination programme pushing forward successfully, but we have been given a roadmap out of the crisis and schools have been placed at the top of the priority list for coming out of lockdown. We all know that this is not a risk-free decision by the Govermment, and the roadmap may need to be adjusted in the months ahead, but the news that children can be back in school from Monday 8 March will raise smiles right across our community and I cannot wait to see the School operating in a face to face context. For me it will be a first taste of "normal" Bourne Grammar life!

As I type this Bulletin on Thursday afternoon I am not quite able yet to put the specific plan to you, though as soon as I am able to do so I will produce a specific communication about the testing and reopening schedule. I am able to tell you now that the Govermment changed its approach to the timing of testing on Wednesday and has now granted schools permission to test students before 8 March if they wish. We want to get our students back on site as soon as we possibly can and so we are working hard on a plan that will get as many of our students tested next week as possible, allowing them a fast start on 8 March. Watch this space: the schedule may arrive very shortly.

What does all this mean for our students? Find your uniform or office dress and brush off the dirt! Locate the pencil case, dig out any exercise books and/or folders and/or resources that you might not have used as much as usual during lockdown and check your timetable. Monday 8 March is a Week 2 and you can begin to look forward to seeing your classmates in person. But also...remember that we still need to wear face coverings, we will still be in bubbles and we still need to keep our hands clean and maintain our space. Testing of students will be on offer for the weeks ahead. So we all continue to have responsibility for ensuring the virus does not spread again so that we can look forward with renewed optimism to the summer and beyond.

Finally, let us continue to keep kindness at the forefront of our thinking. As I have writen before, a kind act has enormous power and when School reopens we need to show more kindness than ever before. Those nervous at returning, those who perhaps test positive next week, those who may have been affected directly by the pandemic in recent weeks and months: all will need our help so let us be kind in all our dealings with each other. Parents have found the lockdown tough, students have found it equally tough, teachers have found it tough too. Not everyone will return to School on their best form, some will be concerned about the GCSE and A Level results process and others will just need time to re-adjust to re-engaging with a live school community. All of this will be challenging but those challenges will quickly dissolve away if we make sure we are individually and collectively kind.

Please remember that the deadline for submitting option preferences is 09:00 on Wednesday 17 March. Before students can select and submit option preferences, access to the options system must be activated. The unique access code that is required to activate the options systems was sent to the School email account of each Year 9 student on 10 February 2021. Please note that this is a one-time-use-only code; once used it will not be needed again and cannot be used again. Once activated the options system can be accessed by going directly to www.sims-options.co.uk and logging in with the email account and password set up at the time of activation.

Once options preferences have been successfully submitted, no further action is required. Please note that your preferences, and any subsequent changes you make, will only be submitted when you 'save' your option selections. The parental consent box does not need to be ticked.
