Remote learning was a challenge for us all, but we fronted up as a community and made the most of an imperfect situation. Our Year 11 and Year 13 students have been fantastic in their approach to learning, assessments and uplifts and I congratulate them on their excellent attitude and substantial commitment to a public examination grades award process that is again an imperfect situation but one we have adapted to successfully. And I must also thank our parents for their patience during lockdown and their commitment to a Covid testing process that was another substantial challenge for the School. None of this, of course, would have been possible without the tremendous efforts of our hard working staff: I could not hope for a better team of people to lead. The term overall has been a triumph of dedication and teamwork from across the School community and I thank everyone for their individual and collective contribution.

On a different note, the recent reports in the media regarding sexual abuse of young people, and some of the testimonies referred to have been truly horrifying. Any form of peer-on-peer abuse, which includes sexual harassment and sexual violence, is always unacceptable and we stand by anyone who has experienced such trauma. The School has robust safeguarding procedures in place to investigate and respond to any known abuse and, in all cases, takes the necessary action alongside the appropriate authorities and agencies. A key challenge for any School is continuously nurturing and promoting a culture where any young person – or adult for that matter – feels able to share any concern, report any incident, and speak up against any wrongdoing. At Bourne Grammar School we have a long-established focus on providing the *Best Atmosphere and Best Support*, and our behaviour policy is built upon safe and respectful relationships; that said, we can never be complacent. If anyone in our School community has experienced any form of abuse and has not previously felt able to come forward, I strongly support and encourage them to do so through the pastoral support channels at School.


