Formal assessments for our Year 11 and Year 13 students are very nearly complete. As I watch the rain come hammering down in a Spring that has been climatologically unusual, I find myself reflecting on the very unusual last two years our public examinations students have experienced. Normal lessons to begin with, then the drift towards the first lockdown with the scramble that ensued as all schools tried to come to terms with communications technology and remote learning. Then back to School in September for an experience that was still restricted, followed by a second difficult period of lockdown. Exams cancelled, events cancelled, and much face-to-face social life put on hold. And then, when School reopened once again in March after a full twelve months of ongoing disruption, they were presented immediately with a raft of assessments in an ongoing restricted bubble environment as teachers worked to gather the evidence required to provide Teacher Assessed Grades. From compulsory lockdown to revision-inspired meltdown.

And what of their wider life context? Families under pressure, the economy in retreat, the future uncertain. No gatherings, no holidays, no sport, no gigs, no outlet for creative instincts. The sum of all this is a two year experience we could not possibly have predicted as we celebrated the New Year in 2020, and for a school-aged generation at comparatively low risk of suffering the worst effects of infection I know there has been a palpable sense of frustration at the enforced isolation. The last few years of school, in addition to acquiring qualifications, is all about social development: friendships, adventure, self-discovery and making memories. Our Year 13 students in particular have missed out on so much.

I wish, therefore, to dedicate this Bulletin to our public examination cohorts and in particular our Year 13 leavers. I want to thank them for their good humour, their hard work and their flexibility in such difficult times. I want to congratulate them on their achievements, and hope they are able to look into the future with optimism for what comes next. I also want to remind them that life is rarely easy and that their ability to manage challenging contexts is fundamentally important. After all, when life throws us a rainy day we must learn to play in the puddles. And finally I want to say something to them that is best expressed in the words of A A Milne. As Christopher Robin says to Winnie the Pooh: "Promise me you'll always remember: you're braver than you believe, and stronger than you seem, and smarter than you think." And so say all of us.

All students in Years 7-10 and Year 12 will have work set to complete at home for the off-timetable day


PRM Evening 1 - Tuesday 6 July 2021 PRM Evening 2 - Thursday 8 July 2021
