

SENECA - Mr Hewitt, Deputy Headteacher (Academic)

I am delighted to announce that the School has recently signed-up to SENECA Learning Premium, an online learning platform which allows students to work at home to reinforce their own learning. SENECA Learning is the UK's most popular learning/revision app, with over 2.5 million users in England alone and there is compelling evidence that regular use of the app can make a significant impact on students' progress.

Each student at Bourne Grammar School has been given their own login details to the School's premium account, allowing them access to every resource in 29 different subjects. Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 have been taught how to use the learning platform in their Computer Science lessons, whilst students in Year 10 to 13 have received guidance in their tutor periods.

The early signs of student engagement are hugely promising; since joining in November our wonderful students have already completed over 17,000 learning sessions. It would be unfair to name the student who has spent the most time learning on SENECA during this time, but your efforts are incredible and Mr Anderson will be writing to you shortly to say well done. 229 hours of online learning and revision have been completed in Science alone!



Our School has placed independent learning at the heart of its curriculum and strives to equip our students with the skills needed to become self-regulated, independent learners. The purchase of SENECA Learning Premium will hopefully help to support students to become more independent and offer an additional resource to students who may have fallen behind due to COVID's impact.


For parents and carers who wish to become involved, SENECA has just released a free parent monitoring platform. This lets you see how long your child has spent on their different subjects, their average score and number of questions answered.

Here are some instructions for getting started:

- 1. Click here to create a parent account (if you arrive at a login page, make sure to click on the 'Sign up' option)
- Click 'See your child's scores' 2.
- 3. Copy and share the unique link with your child (or you can use the e-mail or Whatsapp buttons)
- Ask them to open the link on their phone or laptop (whatever device they typically use Seneca
- Once they've successfully opened the link they'll see a linked confirmation 5.
- Refresh the page on your parent account to review their progress.


I thank all students who have used SENECA Learning so far, and I wish them many more hours of happy learning.

Two weeks ago, we launched our annual Reading Challenge for Year 7 students. Following an assembly, students were set the challenge of reading twenty-five books over the course of the academic year. Despite seeming like an insurmountable task to some, we are always delighted by number of students who rise to the challenge and receive awards at the end of the year.

To support the Reading Challenge, this week our Year 7 students were given their logins for ePlatform, a digital library with access to thousands of eBooks which can be streamed or downloaded onto a personal device. The inclusive platform also enables students to customise backgrounds and fonts to dyslexia-friendly settings. We want Student Voice to play an important role in launching the digital library; therefore, we will be asking for students' feedback and experiences of using the platform in the coming weeks. There is a well-established link between reading for pleasure and academic success, and we hope you will join us in encouraging our students to read widely and regularly outside of School.


