We have students away on two ambitious overseas visits this week: Geographers on Sicily and Physicists at Cern. These sorts of trips are enormously significant educational experiences and despite the looming cost of living crisis we do intend to continue to offer exciting educational opportunities whenever appropriate and possible. The Ski Trip is still on this winter and the Spanish Trip for many in Year 8 is deep in the planning phase. At the same time, we will also continue to plan for a wide array of day trips over the coming months as part of our belief in developing well rounded students with experience of opportunity. As everyone will have to do this coming winter we are preparing to tighten our belt and reduce costs or expenses wherever possible, but I am committed to continuing to offer opportunity.

Here at home in Bourne, it was a week of local activities as usual. We have more clubs starting up, this time the Table Tennis Club and the Year 7 Science Club via written applications to Mrs Woolf, and we had 13 sports' teams in Netball/Rugby/Football/Cross Country take on local opposition. I gather some of our Year 12 students had a wonderful time on Wednesday learning how to cook Thai Green Curry and on a more charitable note Mr Marsden has organised the BGS Live Below the Line 2022 challenge where participating students and staff live off £5 for 5 days in aid of the work of the Hunger Project. Over £500 has already been raised by BGS this week and anyone wishing to support this initiative can donate via the Hunger Project website.

Finally, yesterday evening the Head Students and I were invited by the Town Council to attend an event linked to the history of BRM racing and the current work of the Silverstone Museum. There was a very interesting presentation given – holding a piece of Max Verstappen's car that cost £125,000 to make was an eye opener! – and we have committed to playing our part in reinforcing the links between the racing history in Bourne and the young people who attend our local schools. Workshops for Chemistry, Physics and Engineering students run by Silverstone will be set up in the near future, yet another example of opportunity driven education. Watch this space...
