## CRICKET EAST VOLUNTEERING – Report by Aryan Nahata, Year 10

This summer, I volunteered with Cricket East - Diverse Communities Officer (Dave Summers). We have worked with various organisations/ communities, such as the Barnardo's charity Gunthorpe Holiday Activity Food programme at the PTCC outfield, the Nepalese community in Westwood, and the BHS community in the temple and this has been a fantastic learning opportunity as it provided great exposure to the broader coaching opportunities. All of our work has been vastly different to each other, and the experience I have gained from it is precious.

When working with Barnardo's charity, which footballer Marcus Rashford profiled, we let them choose which sport they wanted to do and helped them organise and enjoy it. However, when working with the Nepalese community, we had two eight-hour coaching sessions in which we coached them on the basics of sports, such as throwing, catching, bowling and batting.

With the Bharat Hindu Samaj temple, we focused on the skills above and how to deal with pressure situations and captaincy.

This helped me understand the importance of cricket on young people's development, as it has physical benefits and helps build leadership, team-building skills, patience and coping with successes and failures. This is significant as it can shape a young person's future.

To recognise all these efforts, I was nominated for my category, selected from all other nominees in the Northamptonshire region. I was given my award by Will Sneath, Club and Community Manager (Huntingdonshire & East Beds). On Monday, I was invited to attend a Northamptonshire vs. Lancashire county cricket match, where I was presented with an award for being a "Rising Star." I also had the opportunity to watch the match and meet some of the coaching staff on the pitch during the lunch interval. They were kind enough to inform me about their jobs and what a day in their career is like. Overall, this was a great experience, which I thoroughly enjoyed.



## INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENTS

Lawson Capes, Year 10, was in action again at the weekend in the England Athletics National Champs at Birmingham Alexander Stadium. Lawson went in as the number one in the UK for both shot & discus. The under 15s discus was going to be tough as so many boys had hit over 40m of late, however, Lawson was the only one entered having hit over 51m.

Having won both titles at the Southern Champs at Lee Valley Lawson was a hot favourite. First up was the shot and Lawson set a new personal best on his last throw with 17.96m to take the title with more than a metre and half. The highly anticipated discus was at the end of the day and the athletes had to deal with a challenging side wind that carried it out of the sector a number of times. Lawson threw 48.62m on his second throw to win the title by more than three metres.

Lawson has had an enviable season as still undefeated in both events and won all major titles. Next up he competes for Lincolnshire again at the inter-counties in two weeks and finishes off September with a couple of opens where he aims to surpass 18m in the shot as he has surpassed 50m in the discus. "It was great to see Lawson do the double, as this is a rare thing to achieve. It has been a record-breaking year with Lawson taking every title and setting the history books," Lewis Capes comments.
