


## SENECA PREMIUM – Mr Hewitt – Deputy Headteacher, Academic

Our School invests in several great online platforms to support students with their learning; the one that is seemingly used the most across the School is called SENECA, named after the philosopher of Ancient Rome.

SENECA is in fact free, but the School pays for the PREMIUM service for the additional content and advantages it provides; SENECA offers an online explanation of learning covered in class, either through videos or written explanations, and then it tests a student's understanding. An algorithm built into the platform removes questions which the student gets correct and focuses future questions on areas they have found more difficult.



As students spend time learning on SENECA they acquire points for themselves and the School from which league tables are generated. SENECA is a great resource for all students from Year 7 to Year 13 and is absolutely ideal for BBL independent learning, Sixth Form Supervised Study Periods and students of any age revising for assessments and exams.



Students' login details are identical to those used for SATCHEL ONE and the School's digital library, E-PLATFORM. If any student cannot access any of these resources, they should seek help from the IT Support team found in the Science Block at the bottom of the stairs. I encourage all students to download the app and make the most of SENECA PREMIUM. Teachers can see

every student's point total and time spent on SENECA; students who engage with this resource in the most impressive ways will be praised and rewarded with prizes later in the Term.


