Around sixty exhibitors provided employment and careers advice sourced from a wide range of future pathways including universities, The Forces, Public Services, local businesses and many companies with a significant national profile. It was superbly organised by Mrs Elliot and the Sixth Form Team and, despite the torrential rain, was very well attended. We are particularly grateful to the Len Pick Trust for helping fund the event and to all our hard working Sixth Form student volunteers who were, once again, excellent.

All three of these evenings demonstrated the importance of home/school partnership and the power of successful communication. Not everyone will have had every question answered or problem solved, but the very act of engaging with the thought process is what matters. Doing our best to ensure that every one of our 1700 students and their families have access to this kind of positive stimulus is a significant challenge given finite resources, and we are proud of the quality and impact we believe we provide. Finally, well done to the students working within the Environment Committee. Their passion and drive have pushed discussions forward and we will be creating a garden for interested students to manage. The environment has been in the news a great deal this week and it is gratifying to see that young people are determined to do what they can to invest in their environmental future. EXTRA SUPPORT FOR SIXTH FORM STUDENTS - Mr Hewitt, Deputy Headteacher, Academic

I am delighted to announce that a new programme of academic support is being offered this year to all students in Year 12 and Year 13. Teachers are making themselves available during their limited non-teaching hours to meet with any student who wishes to drop-in and speak with them. If students have questions about their work, require extra explanation or would like to talk through any independent study they have completed, they can go to the sessions on the timetable to speak with subject-specialist staff.

Students are not permitted to leave their timetabled lessons but otherwise may leave Supervised Study Periods or Free Periods to attend. I hope that as many as possible do attend; this scheme is being trialled for one year and only if students attend and make use of the extra support will it continue and become a permanent part of the academic support we offer as a school.
