BBL CHAMPION AWARD – Mr Hewitt, Deputy Headteacher – Academic

When thinking of famous physicists, it is very easy to just reel off the names of famous men. Women have always played a significant role in physics though are often under-represented and not as regularly acknowledged. As a school it is often the case that our female students perform very strongly in physics, often topping the cohort in terms of exam results. As part of a longer-term plan to address the gender imbalance in the physical sciences some of our students have been researching notable female physicists and preparing displays to help raise their profile around the school.

Students in 10G1 and 10S5 conducted research into the works of physicists such as Leona Woods, Chien-Shiung Wu, Lise Meitner, Marie Curie and Maria Goeppert Mayer as a part of their GCSE study of atomic structure and nuclear radiation.
