COUNTY U16 BADMINTON TOURNAMENT – Report by Miss Bowtell, PE

Our U16 boys travelled to Grantham Meres to play the next round of their National Cup. They had previously been undefeated at the local area but were about to face some strong opposition from the North of the county. Grantham is a focal point for badminton in the region and has for many years produced national champions so the boys were up against it. The team of Jonathan Blair, Tom Drew, Tanish Patel, Bhargav Elakoochy and Georgin Bilroy performed magnificently. They were joined by our fabulous SCITT trainee Holly Sparks who is a Badminton player and former County player herself. She gave the boys some fantastic tactical pointers which seemed to boost their confidence and give them the extra edge they needed.

KS4 BADMINTON – Report by Miss Sparks, PE Trainee Teacher

Last week our KS4 boys travelled to the Meres Leisure Centre, Grantham, to compete in the County Badminton tournament. The boys played remarkably well against some very strong opponents, including Priory Ruskin, Sir John Nelthorpe, Kings School.

The boys first match was against Sir John Nelthorpe although we persisted and incorporated brilliant tactical shots, we were unable to triumph against them. Next was Kings School, this included spectacular service from all players and great teamwork during our doubles games which results in a win for one of our doubles parings. With Tom Drew also winning his singles against Kings School it was all down to the final game that would determine who would claim victory for this match. Unfortunately, this nail-biting game ended in a 15-13 win to Kings School. Finally, the boys faced Priory Ruskin Academy where anticipation was rising due to playing these opponents a few weeks prior. Brilliant drop shots, superb service and magnificent teamwork from all players but unfortunately, we were unable to beat our extremely strong opponents.

Tom Drew was the story of the day winning three singles matches, a feat never matched by anyone previously in this age group from our school. It was a fabulous display against teams consisting of both county, regional and National players and the boys came away far wiser than when they entered.

U14 BOYS COUNTY BADMINTON TOURNAMENT

The Junior team set off with strong intentions to compete at U14 level and again, were unbeaten at the local level. We had our own county player Saihaan Damani playing as No. 1 singles player leading the

way at the start of each game and Ali Ravji playing as No. 2 singles. The doubles pairings were made up of Ali Abdullah and Ali Jaffer and so a very young team for U14 level. We also had our super 5th player, a newcomer to the game, Charles Bomford.

The boys started out very strongly winning 5-0 against Louth Academy but then faced the favourites Priory School, a badminton specialist school. The singles match was epic with each boy focussing so strongly on their play that it had to be externally umpired and sadly Saihaan was narrowly beaten but the game was full of wonderful strokes and touches.

The second singles game with Ali was equally as competitive but again the extra playing experience shone through. The match continued in this vein, with matches being long and very close but was unable to edge out a final result. The boys had qualified for 3rd and 4th playoff and were against Kings Grantham. This game proved to be closer in match scores than the Priory game but lower in quality, due to tiredness. The scores were tied at 2-2 and the deciding game came down to a doubles event with Ali Ravji and Ali Abdullah and the boys lost 21-20. A superb show for a first-time appearance for most at this level of competition.

The team ended up with a draw but really deserved a win after maintaining huge pressure on the Welland goal area all game and as a result the opponents ended up having three solo runs which sadly they scored from.
