Academic in focus

INTERVIEWS

We are looking for

Motivation for course

Ability to think flexibly and critically

Ability to apply knowledge to new problems

Openness to new ideas

We're <u>not</u> looking for

Pre-prepared answers

College choice

Appearance or 'Oxbridge type'

There are no trick questions!






