On Wednesday we took over 65 students to the first major athletics competition of the year. Students competed for the opportunity to present the South Lincs District at the County Championships in early June.

A sea of red could be seen across the track and field events, and it was fantastic to see some new faces competing against some of the best athletes from the local area.

The level that our students competed to was extremely high and in a number of events saw BGS v BGS (and in some cases 2 others from BGS!) as is the calibre of athletes across the school. I could name students from every event that performed well but some standouts from the day were Leah Graham in the 300m and 1500m, Jayden Bembridge competing for the first time flew home to win the Inter Boys 100m, Noah Humphries in the Inter Boys hurdles, Monty Wild across his 3 events as a late replacement performed incredibly well and impressed. Jack Caffrey jumped a new PB in the Junior Boys High Jump and outclassed his opposition in the 200m and Jack Caruthers cleared a staggering 1.80m in the Inter

Boys High Jump. The list of winners and strong performances could be continued throughout the bulletin, but I hope the sunshine and the start of the athletics season resulted in the athletics bug being caught for the upcoming Summer Terms.

The next major event is the Track and Field Cup first round on Tuesday 14 May at Boston. This is the route to National Finals as a School Team. An event that has previous resulted in huge success for the School.

I hope students can continue to make training and push to represent the School Team. It certainly is becoming a very competitive environment, and the level of competition is impressive. Those who can make it to Monday evening training after school will continue to develop further, I am sure and really push for a spot in the National Finals this year.

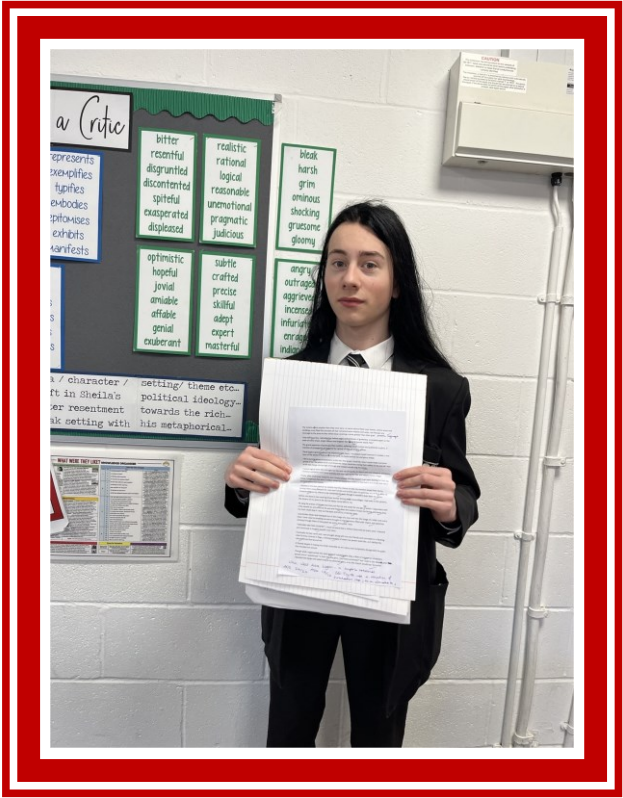


**BBL CHAMPION AWARD – Mr Hewitt, Deputy
